Meeting came to order promptly, Treasurer John J read the treasurers report noting recent expenditures and remaining on account. Ham Camp will be held to assist new licensees with information and equipment.

Nick presented By Laws from San Bernardino Amateur Radio Club to be adapted to our club.

Bullet points:

5-5:7-member minimum required for a quorum at general meeting. Our club is nonprofit. One year membership is currently \$20 runs from June to June. Members must be in good standing, fees paid, to vote.

6-1. Section 6 dropped unanimously by all members present.

Chris raised first motion, Norm second to raise from 10% to 15%-member voting participation. Unanimous approval. Voting qualifications, must hold current FCC license and in good standing.



Sect 7 eliminates term limits on board members. Quorum must be met. Written into the minutes. Anyone willing to request nomination for any board member office can do so by submitting in writing to nomination committee

Duties: President presides over the meetings. Vice President steps in when President cannot perform their duties.

Secretary creates and maintains minutes of the meetings and correspondence. Treasurer handles financial duties and maintains current member roster. Quarter Master handles logistics, equipment, accountability, etc.

Club elections of officers will be conducted annually, around the first of May. Written proxies will be accepted. Will assume new position in July unless there is a vacancy that needs to be filled promptly. Removal, resignation must be in writing. Must be unanimous by all board members. Trustee negotiates with FCC compliance

Reimbursement to Mike and Donna Reed, \$25.66 was approved and paid for storage containers and labels for radio equipment.

October swap meet country store will be managed and maintained by Mark and wife Vicki, additional items for sale this year will be items for sale from Kevin and Korrianna Clay. October swap meet will be October 15th at Polk County fairgrounds.

August VE testing will be in Dallas Saturday 20th at 10 am. September testing September 19th at Macleay Grange 7pm.

Virtual meeting will be held to review rules and regulations.

From Chris KJ7UYT

Things are progressing well with the clubs efforts to expand our outreach and capabilities. We have made many of the purchases that were planned with the grant funding we received. HAMcamp is set to start its first session on the 24th of September followed by an antenna course on the same day and same location. I am looking forward to those events. The prelicense training course, or technician training course, is gearing up to start soon after. I have had several people volunteer to help with instructional and hands-on presentations that fall within the guidelines that have been established for the class. We have basically resurrected the course that existed pre-covid and will be closely following the successful format it has utilized.

In my little corner of the world I have been enjoying my short break between summer and fall terms at school and using the time to work more. Staying busy is great and all but I am really looking forward to next weekend when I have a portable operation planned. Hopefully others will join me on this outing and it will be a good day for atmospheric conditions. I was going to go today, which is September the 4th but there is a geomagnetic storm going down.

I have been able to set up an end fed random wire antenna at my QTH finally and it has provided a much lower noise floor. Also, I have received good reception reports on the phone portion of the 75m band finally. The wire is about 75 feet long, and is not very high off the ground. I am using my 100' length of LMR400 as the counterpoise, which is not usually what I do. I have a 1:1 choke installed at the end of that 100' run where it connects to my tuner and then connects to my FT-891. I have also been doing a little bit of winlink practice, making use of different bands both with Vara HF and Vara FM. I have even worked a bit of peer to peer winlink but have not been satisfied with the level of success just yet.

Planned projects include applying for a frequency on 70cm for my repeater (Kenwood TKR 820) now that I have the flat pack and an antenna similar to a GP9 to use with the repeater. Also, I am considering running the end fed wire in my attic just to experiment with it. Hopefully others will have some time this fall to plan for winter field day after the great success the club had for summer field day this year.
